Eddie's Story

As 2007 wound to a close, a female heartworm-positive Chihuahua and six three-day old puppies had just been surrendered to the shelter. This story is a reminder of just how important the Maui Humane Society and our "Wee Care" Foster

Program volunteers are to our Maui community.

Sadly, surrenders of this kind aren't unusual for the Maui Humane Society. As our Veterinary staff began to assess the health of the litter, there was great concern for one of the puppies. Five of them were of normal weight, but one male puppy weighed barely three ounces - about the size of a child's hand. So tiny and frail and unable to nurse, "Eddie's" chances of survival were slim.

MHS staff decided to contact one of our "Wee Care" Foster parent teams, Jim & Cynthia Lippert, to help. The Lipperts quickly sprang into action taking the little family into their home. "Eddie" had to be bottle fed around the clock. A few days later "Eddie's" heart stopped but was successfully resuscitated by his determined and caring foster parents.

The five "normal" puppies are each a force of nature - loving life in their new adoptive homes.

"Eddie" has been adopted by his foster family and now weighs three pounds. Though he is not "out of the woods," Eddie continues to improve with the Lippert's help and vigilant veterinary care by Dr. Curtis Wilaheur and the staff at Central Maui Animal Clinic...

Without human intervention and loving care "Eddie" may have not survived the odds against him.

The human touch is one of the basic needs we share with our wonderful and very special companion animals. For the animals who pass through our facility each year, the Maui Humane Society and all of our wonderful volunteers are proud to make a difference with the touch from our loving hands.

Audio Book Gift Promotes Cat Lover Donations

Maui author and Maui Humane Society member Bonnie Nelson has taken her love of cats to a new level, making a difference to the fastest cat on the planet – the cheetah – as well as cats here at home.

Author Bonnie Nelson's new audio book, *The Cheetah Portal*, takes listeners on an African safari. She gifted the download of her latest book, *The Cheetah Portal*, a work on CD, to donors of \$100 or more to the Maui Humane Society during the months of February through April to support cat related programs of the Society. "Our local cats deserve our respect and help just as those in far away Africa do. Locally, we need to help our wild cats through spay-neuter programs, internationally we need to help save them from extinction," says Nelson.

Nelson's book transports listeners on safari through the wilds of East Africa where many cheetahs make their home. The cheetah is the oldest cat on the planet, and the fastest – moving at speeds of 80 miles an hour. These cats also are heading toward extinction with only an estimated 12,000 of them left. Nelson wants others to travel with her vicariously on her African safari and share her transforming experience. "The people and wildlife of Kenya face many issues today. At the same time, the beauty of the country and its vastness was life changing for me, very different from my own small Maui paradise. My own issues shrank before me, while the land its people and animals took on a great significance," she says.

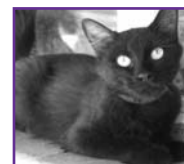
